Category I a and **b** schools are owned and operated by the Archdiocese of Seattle and comply with all sections of the Policies and Procedures for Catholic Schools approved by the Archbishop.

Category Ib schools are incorporated as 501 (C) 3 corporations with the Archbishop of Seattle as sole member.

Bylaws for all schools except Category I Elementary schools and Category II schools are on file with the office for Catholic Schools.

Category I a Regional Schools:

Immaculate Conception, Mount Vernon:

The principal reports to the regional pastor and is advised by a Regional Advisory Council.

Holy Rosary Regional School-Juan Diego Academy, Tacoma:

The principal reports to a Board of Directors, which is responsible for making policy and evaluating the principal.

Category I a Joint Parish School

Assumption-St. Bridget School:

One school serves two parishes under the supervision of a canonical director, whose appointment is governed by a canonically binding agreement between the two parishes, and with the assistance of a “governing council,” which serves as an advisor to the canonical director and as a liaison between the school and two parishes. A school commission directly advises the principal and, indirectly, the canonical director and the governance council.

Category II

Category II schools are owned and operated by entities separate from the Archdiocese of Seattle and comply only with those provisions of the Policies and Procedures for Catholic Schools that specifically apply to them, such as standards for Catholic identity.

Proposed Governance Model (to be approved by the Archbishop): Category 1, with the superintendent as canonical director.

A Category I school is created as a separate juridic person with an advisory school commission and with the Superintendent for Catholic Schools or his/her delegate serving as the canonical director of the school, with responsibility for supervising and evaluating the principal.
